



## 2022 Scholarship Program Criteria

The Maine Chapter of the Construction Financial Management Association (CFMA) is pleased to announce that we will be awarding scholarships again this year. Scholarship awards have typically been between \$1,000 and \$2,500 per recipient, but are dependent on both the availability of funds and the pool of applicants in any given year. These scholarships are intended to assist the student with the **cost of tuition, and are to be used solely for this purpose.** The scholarships will be awarded based on the following criteria:

- Enrolled in a full-time undergraduate program leading to a Bachelor's or Associate degree in Accounting, Finance, Construction Management, Construction Related Engineering Programs or Construction Related Trade Programs. Business Administration/Management majors are also eligible if they have declared a minor in one of the following: Accounting, Finance or Risk Management and Insurance.
- ➤ Connection to the construction industry either directly or through a family member with a preference given to a connection to Maine Chapter of CFMA
- ➤ Academic standing
- > Extracurricular activities and community involvement
- Maine residency or graduate of Maine high school
- ➤ Intent to live and work in Maine upon graduation

We are asking that each institution identify candidates based on the above criteria. The candidates must submit their own application, essay, transcripts and two recent letters of recommendation, <u>as instructed below, no later than October 24, 2022.</u> A CFMA Maine Chapter selection committee will review candidates' applications and select recipients. Candidates will be notified of their outcome by December 4<sup>th</sup>.
