

Diversity is on the rise: 11.7% people of color in 2010 to 15.9% in 2021




Youth population in decline: Fell by 2.6% from 2010-2020



QUARTERLY PERSONAL INCOME



QUARTERLY PAYROLL EMPLOYMENT



Labor force participation is at a low point




Projected Race & Ethnicity for the 13-county region


Michiganders under 18 declined by 7.7% since 2010


Change in working age population between 2001-2010
